0. INTRODUCTION

- the French name for God: L'Éternel (YHWH)
- [BAVINCK] "**Infinity** in the sense of <u>not being determined by time</u> is the eternity of God."
- [AUGUSTINE] *De Diversis Quaestionibus Octoginta Tribus* 17. De scientia Dei "Omne praeteritum iam non est, omne futurum nondum est; omne igitur et praeteritum et futurum deest. Apud Deum autem nihil deest, nec praeteritum igitur nec futurum, sed omne praesens est apud Deum."

0.1. THE WORD "FOREVER"

- **Gen 3:22** ...take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live <u>for ever</u> (וְלַכְּח נָם מָעֵץ הַחִּיִם וְאַכֵּל וְחֵי לְעלְם)
- Ex 3:15 ' This is my name <u>forever</u> (זֶה־שָּׁמִי לְעֹלֶם), and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations.
- "a statute forever" (שוֹלְם Ex 12:14, 17; 27:21; 28:43; Lev 3:17; 7:36; 10:9; 16:31; 17:7; 23:14, 21, 31, 41; 24:3; Num 15:15; 18:23)
- "everlasting hills" **Gn 49:26** The blessings of your father are mighty beyond the blessings of my parents, up to the bounties of the everlasting hills (עֵר־הַאָּוַת עּוֹלֶם). May they be on the head of Joseph, and on the brow of him who was set apart from his brothers.

- "There exists a <u>similarity</u> as well as a difference between God's eternal present and man's consciousness of the present."

1.1. ETERNAL EXISTENCE

- eternity in the heart → Myths; Sci-Fi; art;
 - Gilgamesh → ... Gilgamesh looks for Utnapishtim, the only human being who was granted eternal life by the gods. He wants to learn the secret of how to avoid death.

[Megan ILNITZKI] In the great Mesopotamian epic Gilgamesh, the titular king and founderof the city of Uruk, witnesses the death of his closest companion, Enkidu, and becomes fearful of his own mortality. The anxiety over his own in-evitable demise motivates Gilgamesh to embark upon a quest in search ofimmortality that takes him to the farthest ends of the Earth. At the end ofthe epic, Gilgamesh journeys back to Uruk under the impression that he hadfailed in his quest, as he had not obtained physical immortality. But as KingGilgamesh approaches his beloved city, however, he sees Uruk from an en-tirely new perspective, and he realizes that the piece of himself that lies withinthe very brickwork and fortification of the city is his immortality. Gilgamesh'sjourney therefore ends successfully as he understands that the legacy of hiscity will transcend the mortal boundaries of life and death. - empires; philosophies; artworks...
- funeral speeches: perpetual remembrance...
- **Gn 11:4** "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth."

2. ETERNITY AND THE BEING OF GOD

2.1. GOD – THE NECESSARY BEING

- "If anything exists, something has to exist necessarily".
- \Rightarrow "If there is a god, his/its(?) being is necessary". *Being there* (existence) belongs to the definition of the word "god".
- \Rightarrow It is impossible to think of an "non-existent god". It is an oxymoron.
- God (YHWH) is outside time-space reality.
- He attributes of absolute independence (\rightarrow aseitas; infinity; glory; immutability; faithfulness...)

2.2. GOD INHABITS ETERNITY

Isa 57:15 (שֶׁבֶן עֵד) → no decay; no fatigue; no boredom...

- dwelling = "home", permanent abode; intimacy; "at home"
- dwelling = "starting point" of every activity
- dwelling = resting place; peace; "just being there"

2.3. GOD – THE FATHER OF ETERINITY

- God's eternal salvation
 - **Is 43:10-13** ...know and believe me and understand that I am he (בִּי־אֲנִי הוּא). <u>Before me</u> no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me (לְפַנֵי לֹא־נוֹצֵר אֵל וַאָּחָרִי לֹא יְהֵיֶה). ¹¹I, I am the

LORD, and besides me there is <u>no savior</u>. ¹²I declared and saved and proclaimed, when there was no strange god among you; and you are my witnesses," declares the LORD, "and I am God. ¹³Also <u>henceforth</u> I am he; there is none who can <u>deliver from my hand</u> (נְּם־מִּיּוֹם); I work, and who can turn it back?"

- Isa 9:6 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father (אַביעָב), Prince of Peace.
- Rev 1:8 "I am the Alpha and the Omega (τὸ ἄλφα καὶ τὸ ὧ)," says the Lord God, "who is and who was and who is to come (ὁ ὧν καὶ ὁ ἦν καὶ ὁ ἐρχόμενος), the Almighty."
- Rev 21:6 And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end
 (ἐγώ [εἰμι] τὸ ἄλφα καὶ τὸ ὧ, ἡ ἀρχὴ καὶ τὸ τέλος). To the thirsty I will give from the spring of
 the water of life without payment.
- Jesus Christ:
 - the Father of our eternal life
 - the Father of the future eternal world

3. ETERNITY AND OUR HOPES

3.1. ALWAYS FUTURE

- hope without end
- John 17:3 ...this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent (αὕτη δέ ἐστιν ἡ αἰώνιος ζωὴ ἵνα γινώσκωσιν σὲ τὸν μόνον ἀληθινὸν θεὸν καὶ ὃν ἀπέστειλας Ἰησοῦν Χριστόν.)
- Rom 15:13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may <u>abound in hope</u>

3.2. ALWAYS FRESH

- Rom 6:4 ...as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life (ἐν καινότητι ζωῆς)
- Isa 40:31 they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength (יַחֲלִיפּוּ בֹּחַ); they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint (יַעַלוּ אָבָר בַנִּשְׁרִים וַרוּצוּ וַלֹא יִינְעוּ יֻלְכוּ וְלֹא יִינְעוּ יִלְכוּ וְלֹא יִינְעוּ יִלְכוּ וְלֹא יִינְעוּ יִּעְבוּ)
- 1Thes 4:17 we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord (καὶ οὕτως πάντοτε σὺν κυρίφ ἐσόμεθα)
- freshness; youthful vigour...

4. TO REMEMBER

- The eternity of God is his necessary attribute of being. Whoever/(whatever) is eternal, he is divine.
- Our deep desire for "eternal present" is a God-given gift that only he can give.
- We can share the eternity of God only through Jesus, his cross and his resurrection.
